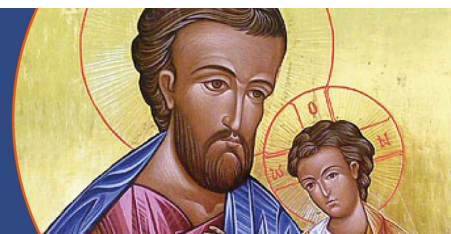

Intermediate Open Night

On **Thursday 26 July** the school will be running an Intermediate Open Night. This event is designed to inform future intermediate children and their families of the wonderful intermediate programme we have organised for the year ahead.

Science Fair - The school Science Fair was reintroduced in 2017. All students in Year 7 and 8 complete an individual or group STEM investigation. The investigation is then presented in a physical display which is evaluated by a panel of external judges from St Bedes College and Ara. The exhibits will be available to the public from Wednesday afternoon

Global Youth Ambassador Programme - During the July holidays the school will be sending a delegation of students and teachers to Beijing as part of the Global Youth Ambassador programme. This programme will be offered again to students enrolled in Year 7 and 8 at St Joseph's School in 2019. The majority of the costs are covered by One World Education. 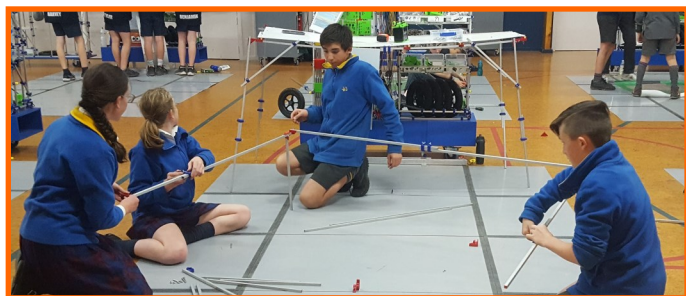

Free Dental Care for children

including information regarding Year 8 students

The Community Dental Service preventive mobiles will be visiting our school soon. They will be aiming to see that all school age children enrolled with the Community Dental Service have their dental check-up in the dental mobile while it is here.

Year 8 students: all year 8 students enrolled with the Community Dental Service are transferred from the Community Dental Service to a FREE private dentist from year 9 until their 18th birthday. To help with this transition please ensure you have informed your child of the family dentist (not orthodontist). This will enable them to transfer your child onto the correct dentist for year 9 onwards. More information will be sent home after their year 8 check-up.

To do this they will be asking the school to provide your child's name, address and your contact information.

The dental therapist will not only be checking the children's teeth but will also Xray, clean, and apply protective treatments fluoride and or Fissure sealants (coating put on teeth to prevent decay) if required.

If your child requires further dental care such as fillings they will bring home a 'Care Plan' which will explain what dental care and appointment times are required. When you receive the 'Care Plan' please contact the **Call Centre as soon as possible** as you will need to arrange a time to bring your child to one of the Community Clinics for this dental care.

Please let them know ASAP if you do not wish your child to have any of this care, you can talk to the staff in the mobile or phone/email our Call Centre.

If you wish to be present at your child's check up this will need to take place at our community clinic so please phone/email our **Call Centre** to make an appointment.

Please contact the Call Centre if you want further information on the Community Dental Service, to enrol your child or if you have any specific questions about your child's dental care (a dental therapist will call you back) **To contact the Call Centre: phone 0800 846 983 / email commdental@cdhb.health.nz**
